



Identification and management of outbreaks of COVID-19 in care/residential homes

Do **two or more** residents in the same area of the care home have **any** of the following symptoms?



Fever of
37.8°C
or above



A new, continuous
cough

If you notice two or more residents meeting these criteria, occurring within 48 hours in the same area of the care home, you may have an outbreak of COVID-19.



Contact the local PHE Health Protection Team on 0113 386 0300, so a risk assessment can be undertaken



What the HPT will do:

- Work with care home staff to identify the cause of the outbreak
- Advise on infection prevention and control measures

Ensure standard infection control measures are put in place immediately, including (but not limited to):

- Isolate resident for 7 days from symptom onset.
- Close the home to visitors, admissions and discharges for 14 days (discharges to be discussed with hospital and HPT).
- Staff in contact with the resident to use PPE.
- Care home to ensure all staff, visitors and residents are aware of and practice good respiratory and hand hygiene.
- Ensure appropriate cleaning procedures are adhered to.
- **We advise if any staff members are symptomatic (temperature $\geq 37.8^\circ\text{C}$ or new, continuous cough) then they should self-isolate at home for 7 days from symptom onset.**

- If patient requires hospital transfer, **please ensure receiving department and ambulance service are informed of outbreak.**
